MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CALIFORNIA STATEWIDE COMMUNITIES DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

February 20, 2025 at 2:00 pm

Commission Secretary Kevin O'Rourke called the meeting to order at 2:03 pm.

1. Roll Call.

2. Consideration of the Minutes of the February 6, 2025 Regular Meeting.

Consider the following resolutions for certain SCIP Community Facilities Districts in respect of multiple development projects for Series 2025A or a future bond issuance:

Resolution approving joint community facilities agreements, if applicable, declaring intention to establish or annex territory to each SCIP Community Facilities District, designating an improvement area therein, if applicable, identifying territory for future annexation, if applicable, and levying special taxes therein to finance certain public improvements and fees; and
- 2. Resolution to incur bonded indebtedness to finance certain public improvements and fees within each SCIP Community Facilities District and calling for a public hearing.

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY:

The actions requested today by the Commission are to initiate the first steps in connection with the six community facilities district projects expected to be included in the SCIP 2025A pool.

The eight assessment district projects were considered at the February 20, 2025 meeting. Attachment A includes a breakdown and location of the projects. The estimated total amount of the 2025A SCIP financing is \$53 million, the largest SCIP issuance since the program began in 2003, and will result in the construction 1,770 new single-family homes.

The resolutions include the following actions:

PURPOSE: Conduct second reading and adoption of ordinances levying a special tax within

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY:

The actions requested today by the Commission are the final steps in connection with the formation of Mariposa (City of Lathrop) and Johnson Ranch Estates (City of Yuba City) community facilities districts that are expected to be included in the SCIP 2025A pool. The Commission held the public hearing and approved the requisite resolutions at the February 20, 2025 meeting.

The two projects will result in the construction of 148 new single-family homes in the cities of Lathrop and Yuba City.

Subsequent approvals of the financing will be brought back to the Commission at April 17, 2025 meeting.

SUBJECT: Consideration of scholarship awards for the Local Government Summer

BACKGROUND & RECOMMENDATION:

The CSCDA Commission approved providing \$32,000 in support for the 2025 LGSI Scholarship fund, which will enable four local government executives to attend the 2025 program who would otherwise not be able to participate.

Other applicants were from the cities of Sausalito, Santa Clara, Pleasanton, Los Altos Hills and Palm Springs. The above-referenced recommendations are based upon geographic and demographic diversity for the LGSI program.
